5 CLAUT: COL DEI PIAIS, ETHNOGRAPHY AND THE ENVIRONMENT



PROGRAMME

The trail is located in the village of Claut, known for its important warrelated historical events. In fact, the famous alpine road that connects two main valleys winds through this area.

These days, Claut is a point of reference for sport thanks to its prestigious facilities, such as a sports hall and ice rink, but also thanks to numerous natural sites suitable for mountain sports such as canyoning, climbing, bouldering and ski mountaineering.

- Meet with the nature guide in Claut piazza (PN).
- Guided tour of Col dei Piais, a hiking trail suitable for all, that allows visitors to explore numerous naturalistic and ethnographic features. Its location is perfect for understanding the geography of the local area, the Valle del Cellina, its settlements and the deep valleys dominated by imposing dolomites on either side. Along the way, visitors can also visit Ciafurle gorge, which is in the process of being eroded by water. The trail is four kilometres long, with an altitude difference of 276 metres and a journey time of about three hours.
- Packed lunch at the Visitor Centre.
- Architectural visit to "Casa Clautana Museum," an Ethnographic Museum dedicated to women who worked at home, in the fields and in barns, while walking "fora par mont" (around the world), a pivotal figure at the heart of family life and the activities that supported the mountain populations many centuries ago.

Guided tour through the streets in order to look at the interesting buildings and characteristic Ciasa da Fum, a 400-year-old house restored and preserved in all its original glory.

• End of guided tour.

LENGTH OF TIME

• Full day, adaptable half-day

If it's raining, activities will take place indoors, and alternative activities will be arranged at the visitor centres. The programme can be modified according to group needs.

MATERIALS REQUIRED FOR THE EXCURSION

- Hiking boots or sturdy trainers and appropriate clothing for a mountain hike.
- Waterproof jacket
